



Significant Accounting Policies

General information

Inland & Coastal Shipping Limited (1&CSL) has been formed as a wholly owned subsidiary of The Shipping Corporation of (I) Limited (SCI) with Corporate Office at Kolkata on 29.09.2016 to harness business potential in the areas of inland and coastal shipping.

1. Basis of preparation, measurement and significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below.

1.1 Basis of Preparation

(a) Compliance with Indian Accounting Standards

The financial statements of the company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") and current practices prevailing within the Shipping Industries in India. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and short-term deposits, as defined above.




